The book of Genesis. What is it? Who wrote it? Was it passed down around the campfire for generations before writing was invented? Is it just a bunch of myths?

Air Commodore (Royal Air Force) P J Wiseman studied the literary forms of the Sumerians and found within Genesis evidence that the first thirty-six chapters (plus 37:1, 2a) had originally been written as a series of eleven histories in cuneiform, the written language of ancient Mesopotamia.

No one can talk intelligently about Genesis and creation without having studied this seminal work.
